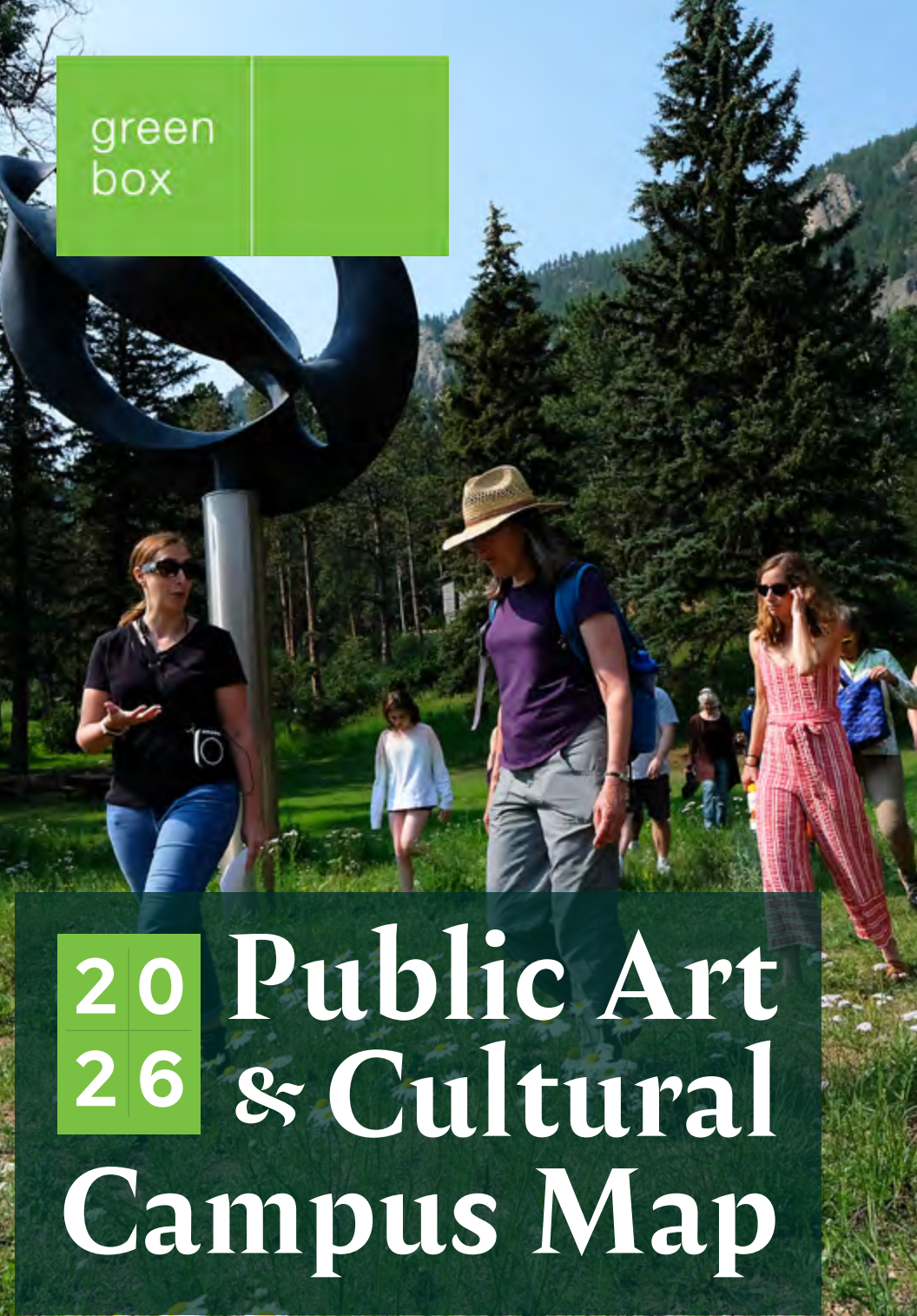

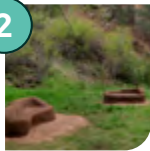


Communication X9 by Yaacov Agam

This first in a series of land-based public art projects aims at healing through the creation of earth markers, a sustainable practice of structure building, uplifting awareness of Indigenous history, present day visibility, and messages of the land.

Untitled (African Red I) by Jose Dávila

This 2015 sculpture was created by contemporary Mexican artist Jose Dávila as part of a striking series of geometric stone sculptures that explore delicate material tension, weight, and balance.

Keith Haring Fitness Court

One of the most renowned artists of the 1980's, Haring's work responded to urban street culture. This piece takes elements of his best known designs and incorporates them into a tactile, interactive, outdoor fitness court.

Open House by Billy Joe Miller

This large-scale installation takes the form of an open sanctuary. Built from a monumental wood frame featuring a canopy of colored acrylic tiles, this structure creates an ever-changing environment of light and shadow.

226.5' Arc x 4 by Bernar Venet

The most internationally exhibited artist from France, Venet used intuition, as opposed to preparatory drawings, to shape each curve of steel to create visually captivating forms.

Remember by Ziba Rajabi

On view through October, this textile-based installation created through our artist-in-residency program utilizes Joy Harjo's celebrated poem of the same name as its inspiration.

Celestial Journey by Cory Feder

On view through October and created through our artist-in-residency program, this installation explores the storytelling of Asian history in Colorado through the regional tradition of Colcha embroidery.

Loveletter by Pard Morrison

Colorado native and active artist in the Pikes Peak Region, Morrison describes his works as "momentary portraits of systems that are in flux."

Four Orbits by Charles O. Perry

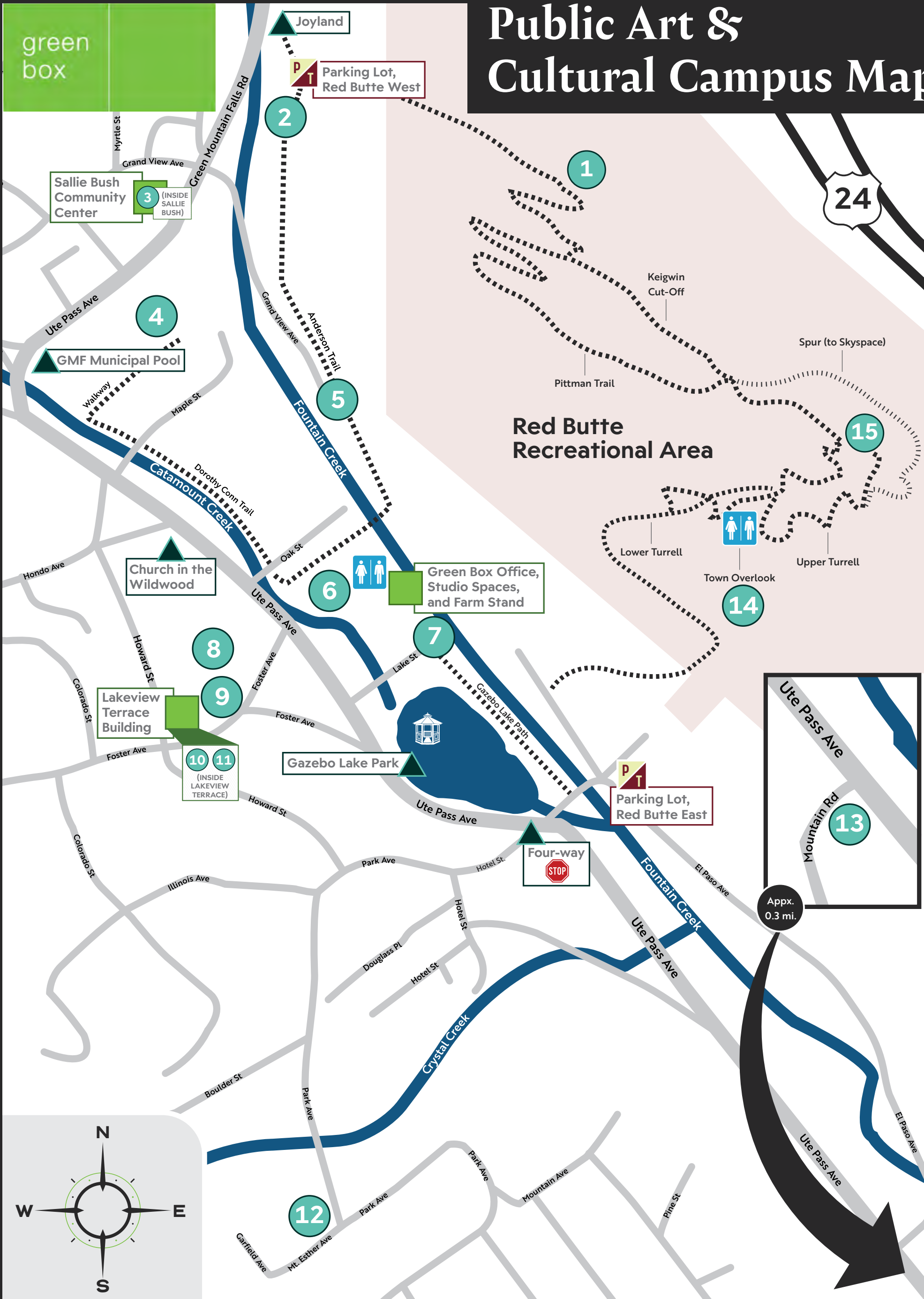


Faime Walking by Julian Opie
